

Birds: The flying kind - not the two legged kind

T'is the start of the season, Snowbirds are returning to Florida, this made me think of another bird seen on a visit to England this summer. The rare, and not often seen flying, Vulcan Bomber.

Yes: backdropped against another rare event in England, a clear blue sky.

This year British Airshows were celebrating the 70th anniversary of The Battle of Britain.

The sighting of the Vulcan Bomber, took place at Bournemouth, on the south coast of England, which faces toward the beaches of Normandy. The Vulcan, one of only two still flying, was spotted the day before the Bournemouth Airshow on an unscheduled practice flight. What a sight!!. What a truly beautiful rare bird. It did a slow flyby along the waters edge at approx. 500ft above the English Channel. A clear blue sky, the Sun reflecting off its fuselage and shimmering across the sea, even the squawking Seagulls showed respect for this historic airplane. Six big white birds, of the feathered kind, flew in escort alongside the Vulcan. Sometimes those unexpected moments are the best. A point of note the Vulcan Bomber was unable to fly at the airshow due the ceiling going down to under 200ft.
