Young People from the Leesburg Area Take to the Air Thanks to the Experimental Aircraft Association By Ted Luebbers

Under a perfect blue sky flying day, 14 young folks from Fruitland Park and Wildwood, Florida experienced their first flight in a single engine aircraft courtesy the Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 534 at the Leesburg International Airport. Everyone congregated at the chapter hangar on Saturday October 25, 2014 to take part in the EAA Young Eagles program designed to acquaint children with general aviation. Many times this program will inspire individuals to acquire their own private pilot license or seek careers in aviation. EAA offers this program nationally through its local chapters to young people ages 8 to 17. On a national basis EAA is approaching 2 million Young Eagles-Flights.

On this day children of families associated with the Helping Hands Program of the United New Covenant Methodist Church in the Villages, Florida had fun flying around the greater Leesburg area. They arrived at the hangar with their parents or guardian, signed up for the Young Eagles Flight Program, met their experienced EAA pilot and headed out to the flight line. At that point they were instructed how to preflight the aircraft, climbed aboard and headed for the wild blue yonder. Once airborne many of them actually took the controls of the plane under the careful supervision of the pilot.

EAA chapter members supplied 5 fixed wing single engine aircraft and one helicopter for the day's activity and many chapter members were there to shepherd kids around the airport ramp area and to take care of all the necessary paper work. A good time was had by all.
